Your institutional DSM-IV-TR Online Only subscription includes access to:

2. **Previous editions of DSM** are included here for reference and archival purposes. Each edition is provided in Adobe's Portable Document Format (PDF). You need Adobe's Reader 5.0.5 or higher to view and print the PDF files. You can download the latest version for free from Adobe here.

These editions are not searchable from the main PsychiatryOnline.com search interface; however, each edition is searchable on its own using the Adobe Reader search.
